Work Zone Speed Cameras

The Washington State Department of Transportation has released

RFP 2024 0402 for Work Zone Speed Cameras.

Background:

The Washington State Legislature amended RCW 46.63.030 and 46.63.075 and added RCW 46.63.200, a new section in chapter 46.63 RCW, granting permission for Speed Safety Cameras to be used in Highway Work Zones. This act, Engrossed Substitute Senate Bill 5272, was signed into law on April 4, 2023, and became effective on July 23, 2023. In addition, Engrossed Substitute Senate Bill 6115 was signed into law on March 26, 2024 that includes amendments to the original bill. The Washington Department of Transportation (WSDOT), in concert with Washington State Patrol (WSP), the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH), and other state agencies, are committed to employing methods to improve safety in work zones for both construction/maintenance workers and the traveling public. One method that has been proven to reduce excessive speeding in work zones is the use of Speed Safety Cameras. WSDOT is issuing this Request for Proposals (RFP) to obtain a System Administrator (SA) to provide field and back-office services to support a new Work Zone Speed Cameras (WZSC) program. WSDOT will serve as the agency responsible for operation of this program and WSP will be responsible for enforcement and adjudication of this program.

Purpose:

WSDOT is initiating this solicitation to acquire a SA that will provide equipment, data collection services, customer service, violation processing, appeals processing and support, and payment processing in support of the WZSC program
